

Physics Project Intro

Everyone is responsible for doing and turning in their own work on this form.

To start this grand experiment you first need to figure out what the options are, what the expectations are, and how you will be evaluated. All that information is on the school's Moodle site. Spend some time here at school and possibly at home kicking around the site. Make sure you login as yourself and visit the places specifically listed below so I can give you credit. (If you work as a pair or are logged in as someone else, only the person who's logged in will receive credit – sorry!)

1. Navigate to <http://moodle.wmchs.net>
2. Login using the button in the upper right corner.
Username: Same as your network login here at school.
Password: “Wmc” followed by your student ID # (for example: Wmc1204782).
If that's not working, click “Forgotten your Username or Password”, type in your school email address, and it will give you your username and a new password (after you click a link in the email).
3. Navigate to “Independent Research in Physics”
4. If told the class is locked and you need an enrollment key, type *cheeseburger* in the enrollment key box and click “Enroll Me”. You should have to only do this one time.
5. While logged in as yourself, navigate to and read through the information in the places listed below. There is information there that is very important for you to know.
 - a. Project Grading Rubric
 - b. Using the School Building and Resources
 - c. Personal Device Guidelines (optional)
6. Explore some of the various project options and see what interests you. Everyone needs to have at least a first and a second choice. Make sure you clearly understand the expectations for a project before you request it. If you are unsure of what it's saying, ask! Once you start a project, you will be held responsible for completing all of the listed expectations.
7. Fill in the project request form on the back of this sheet and turn it in.

Note: Almost all projects are individual projects. A couple allow a group of two. I **strongly** implore you to not pick a project just because you want to work with a friend. It is by far better to pick what you're interested in. Some friendships have been tested as a result of this project. If you request a group project, make sure it is the same choice (first, second, or third) for both of you. For logistical reasons, you may only partner on a project with people from your own class.
